1. Call to order – Chair, Ed Storey. The meeting was called to order at 7:58 AM.
2. Operations update.
 - A. Polyfluoroalkyl (PFAS). There is currently no trace of PFAS in our water. However, the aquifer water flow is from the south, from Mexico, and PFAS are showing up in Nogales, AZ. Thus, it is likely that PFAs will become evident in the future. We currently test for PFAS biannually.
 - B. Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA). John Curry, owner of New River Automation, is the current provider of system support and will retire in December 2026. He is approximately 76 years old. He indicated that he will still be available for small jobs. We discussed adding the funds in the FY 2027-28 budget to send Angel Monarque to the SCADA class. We will work toward getting Mr. Curry together with the new SCADA company at our job site.
 - C. Real-time chlorine dosing control is in the 2026 budget and will proceed.
 - C. Time-of-Use electricity pricing. Matt will talk to Tucson Electric Power (TEP) about possible savings.
 - D. Update on the Freeport-McMoRan Mine. Matt was in contact. They have no plans to require the movement of our tanks.
 - E. Update on the San Ignacio Well. We will work with WLB to finalize specs to be able to proceed with seeking contracts for the work. Mike will ask WLB to update the overall model to include the expansion. Even though Riley did the last model update, Mike prefers WLB as they are quite familiar with our system. However, WLB has had some recent retirements, making contact more difficult.
 - F. Tank materials. When we consider the size of tanks we will require at the expansion, the consensus is that the same (steel) material used for our current tanks is best for future tanks.
 - G. Update on Fire Hydrant Upgrades. The price from Dominguez Earthmovers, Inc. is on the high side, and Mike is negotiating. No other vendors have responded when asked to quote. The pipe is currently asbestos cement (AC), complicating the issue. Also, Dominguez Earthmovers has a small window of availability.
 - H. Call to the Public. No comments.
 - I. The committee has elected to move the meetings to 8:00 AM, Thursday, the week before the board of directors meeting. The date coincides with the financial committee meetings, which will enable board directors and advisors to readily attend the technical and/or finance committee meetings.
 - J. The next Technical Advisory Committee meeting is scheduled for Thursday, September 17, 2026, at 8:00 AM, at the Green Valley Water District conference room.
